

The 10 Building Blocks of Primary Care

Share the Care™ Bingo

Background and Description

This interactive activity provides a safe way for clinic staff to have an initial conversation about team roles and to learn what nurses, medical assistants, behaviorists, and clerks are doing at other clinics.

Instructions

This activity is ideal for mixed clinician and staff meetings. The "caller" will draw a tile with a position name (e.g., Nurse – RN, Medical assistant – MA), and players may cover one square (and only one square!) with a task that is most appropriate for that person to do. When someone covers five squares in a row, they should shout "Bingo!" If their answers are correct, they win the hand. After playing several rounds of bingo, go over each square and discuss with the group who is the optimal person to do this role. At the end of the activity, we have suggestions for the tasks that we would assign to each role based on our experience with high performing primary care clinics. Note that in some case, we would consider more than one person to be an appropriate person to carry out the described task.

Share the Care™ Bingo

Objective: To provoke discussion about team member roles.

This is a great activity for opening conversation about what nurses, medical assistants, behaviorists, and clerks are doing at other clinics.

How to play

Preparation: Copy the bingo cards (attached) so that you have enough for every participant. Cut out the drawcards (next page). Place these drawcards in a hat or bag so that you can draw one on each turn.

- 1. Caller will pull a drawcard from the hat. Each drawcard says "clinician," "nurse," "behaviorist," or "medical assistant." If you have other roles at your clinic, you may create your own drawcards for these roles!
- 2. Participants should mark one (and only one) task on their bingo card that they believe the person indicated on the drawcard can and should perform. They will mark their cards by writing on the block with the role (e.g., nurse).
- 3. The goal of the game is to get a "bingo" of 5 marked squares in a straight vertical, horizontal or diagonal row. When someone gets a bingo, they should stand up and yell "Bingo!" Prizes may be distributed.
- 4. After playing a few rounds, go over each square and discuss with the group who is the optimal person to do this role. For example, a clinician may take vitals, but this would not be a great use of his or her time. Our recommendations are listed on the last page.

Discussion

After playing several rounds of bingo, go over each square and discuss with the group who is the optimal person to do this role. For example, a clinician may take vitals, but this would not be a great use of his or her time.

Based on our experience with high performing primary care clinics, here are the tasks that we would assign to each role. Note that in some case, we would consider more than one person to be an appropriate person to carry out the described task.

There are great examples of clinics where each of these team members routinely carries out these roles!
